

Greetings Fair Atlantia,

I wish to announce that there will be a performance competition at the upcoming Ponte Alto event "A Day at the Races" in November. The theme of the event is 16th century Italy and so to the competition will be focused on this country and period. Here are some criteria to consider for the competition:

* An actual period piece: An original piece done in a style commensurate with 16th century Italy (this can be about the SCA, Atlantia, and/or the Barony of Ponte Alto and/or its Baron and Baroness).

Minimal documentation will be necessary. Types of performances can be vocal or instrumental music, dance, poetry, theatrical presentation or any other proven period performance art. No performance will be turned away, but adherence to the above criteria will count toward your overall score. Naturally the judges will be looking for performance skill and style as well as what is performed and accompanying documentation. In the case of theatrical presentations, please keep them under five minutes in length. If you have written an original play please have a copy of the entire work available for perusal by the judges.

I need judges. I will be judging but I need at minimum two more to make up an odd number. If you wish to judge please contact me. I would like judges who are familiar with judging performances. Anyone having direct familiarity with 16th century Italy will certainly be most welcome.

I have chosen to put a narrow focus on this competition so that it may make it easier for the competitors to research their entry. I would like this to be a learning experience more than "just another bardic competition". I hope this will encourage you, the performers of Atlantia to come out and show off your skills.

We even mostly followed our director at the concert, what a concept! (Right, Anne?) What was new was that I met lots of fellow singers who I am definitely looking forward to singing with again in the future. Altos rock!

Something else that sticks in my memory: the most awesome Pennsic showers!! Vivat to our Ponte Alto Shower Engineer, William!

Something I'm desperately trying to erase from my memory: the swamp that was our campsite Friday night. The Pennsic Chocolate Moo I brought home did help to ease that memory, anyway! Prior to "Charlie's" arrival, though, the Pennsic weather was cool, dry, and the best I've seen yet.

So, there was much fun, but as always, never enough time to do everything. But thankfully there is next Pennsic to look forward to!

* Bardic circles - A meeting of performers (bards), typically singers, storytellers, and poets, generally gathered in a circle, sometimes around a fire, sometimes including folks who are just audience, where each person in turn around the circle is asked to perform. Generally each person has the option to Pick (pick someone else in the circle to perform instead), Pass (pass to the next person in the circle) or Play (perform themselves). Unless you go to the Longbow bardic circle, where Earl Mika Longbow Picks, and everyone else lives with it. :)

** Seige crew - A relatively new addition to the realm of Heavy Fighting includes Siege Engines. Siege engines are mechanical devices that fling rocks into enemy forces or buildings to take them out. Siege Engines must be captained by an authorized Siege Engineer (the person who built the engine) and must be crewed by 1 or more people to assist in loading the engine with rocks and launching those rocks.

*** Bridge battles - Each day of War Week (the second week of Pennsic) brings different kinds of battle scenarios. On Wednesday, these were the Bridge Battles. In this scenario, hay bales are setup in the middle of the field in lines representing the sides of bridges. Five such bridges are setup, and the forces of the Middle and her Allies are on one side, while the East and her Allies are on the other. The object of each bridge battle is to hold the most bridges at the end of the battle. The bridges are assumed to be over a river or cliff or something, so that falling off a bridge means death.





Siobhan (mka Laura Storey) Pennsic XXXIII

This was not my first Pennsic, but my first Pennsic as an SCA member. I've come to War for years now -- driving out from Chicago, more recently from NoVA . . . this was the first time I identified my road trip's start point in terms of "Barony" or "Kingdom." Now, I'm a Pontoon!

I've only attended one local event earlier this year, so I'm still feeling out how the "real" (local) SCA compares to my "on the sidelines/not an SCA member" Pennsic experiences. (I still am trying to figure out the points on the hats and how to address people; I'm liking "my lord / lady" very much of late!)

This war, things were different -- partly because XXX was the last War I made, but it was largely due to Lady Bianca di Bari camping with my clan this War. Lady Bianca has played for many years, in five kingdoms (if I recall correctly), and was an "SCA guide" for me at War. Wandering Pennsic-town with her was decidedly different: not the least because she could tell a Baron from a Duchess and a Tuchuk from a wannabe; she, too, is a member of the Cult of the Coopers Chocolate Milk, and I'd never turn down a chance to "just stop by Coopers." (Can we import some? I'm a huge fan.)

I accompanied Lady Bianca on her rounds to catch up with friends from other kingdoms, and had a wealth of SCAdian experiences:

And, I have volunteered to help at Chalice, my second local event; hope to see you there!





I still enjoy the same things about Pennsic that I enjoyed before I joined . . . I'll just "get it" a bit more at XXXIV!

Well, my Pennsic was quiet but relatively pleasant. Apart from discovering that my new tent leaked, my great memory was guarding the Crowns of Atlantia during an interval when Their Majesties' Retainers hadn't come on duty...

Also, watching the Field Battle with the Combat Archers was breathtaking . . . huge masses of troops maneuvering around the field, arrows & missiles flying thick overhead. . . I remember thinking "If only we could figure out how to get some horses in here. . . "

Favorite activity? That's gotta be the choir concert. Thanks to Lord John and others, the choir practices were easier to deal with than the last time I directed; the choir concert itself was much, much better, probably due to the size of the group assembled. I had 65 singers this time, as opposed to about 50 or so two years ago. The sound was really awesome.

New stuff? I got to see a battle from the inside. That was VERY cool. I had a staff medallion, and got to use the staff shower. Twice.

But one experience I would be happy to NOT repeat again was the Saturday, 12:20am, episode when I decided that it was raining too much, Tirloch hadn't returned yet from closing troll, and I better get up and check that the stakes were all still holding. I threw back the covers, stepped out of bed, and my feet went splash. Yep, I could do without ever having a "splash" inside the tent again.

* Troll - (n) the front gate, where one pays/signs waivers to enter an event. (n) a volunteer who works the front gate (v) to troll = to work at the front gate. At Pennsic, troll is open 24x7 from noon on the Friday of landgrab weekend till midnight on Friday two weeks later. It takes a lot of volunteers working a lot of hours to keep troll open for those people who arrive at Pennsic.

** Landgrab - the process by which camping spots are parceled out to groups at Pennsic. The process has evolved significantly over the years, because there hasn't always been a pre-registration process. It was, I believe, originally a first come/first





choice approach, just like most of our events today. It evolved to having an day about a week before the event really started when squatters could come and claim and hold land for their group (which is when the term "land grab" started, I think). And today the process is very organized ahead of time (some would say bureaucratic) based on pre-registrations. "Landgrab" is now the term also used for the day and time when the land allotment process kicks off (Saturday, at 9am).

Belphoebe

This Pennsic was a bit different from others since this was my first Pennsic as Baroness of Ponte Alto. For the first time since I have been going to Pennsic, I camped with the Barony instead of my Household, Fallen From Grace. I was a little bit anxious as to how it was going to work but to my delight it was wonderful. Everyone was great and made sure that we had a wonderful time. It was wonderful to see all of our friends, whether they were camping at Ponte Alto or someplace else, get together every night for chats, songs and laughter around the fire. It was like having a party every single night!

The Charter of the Barony of Ponte Alto

I. Concerning this charter

- A. All provisions of this charter are subject to Kingdom law and Corpora.
- B. This charter may be amended as follows:
 - 1. A proposed amendment must be submitted at a Barony meeting.
 - 2. If the consensus of the meeting is that the proposed amendment is a good idea, a meeting shall be selected at which to conduct a straw poll.
 - 3. The proposed amendment shall be published in two issues of the newsletter before the meeting designated for the straw poll. If approved by 60% of those voting in the straw poll, it shall take effect upon publication in the next issue of the newsletter. A member unable to attend may send a written opinion to the meeting to be counted in the straw poll.

II. Baronial Heads

- A. There need not be both a Baron and a Baroness. There may be either or both.
- B. The Baron and/or Baroness shall serve for a term of two years.
 - 1. At the end of the first term, they may serve a second term should that be the desire of the group [evidenced by a vote of confidence, per Kingdom law] and of the Crown.
 - 2. At the end of the second term, they are not eligible for the next term, per Kingdom law. They may serve the term after that.
- C. Candidacy for Baronial Heads
 - 1. Candidates may be self-nominated or nominated by another person.
 - a. All nominations must be made at a Barony meeting designated for that purpose.
 - b. Potential candidates must accept nomination in writing. If a potential candidate is not present at the meeting where he/she is nominated, the seneschal shall inform them of their nomination. The candidate(s) must accept nomination by the next meeting.
 - 2. Persons nominated to serve as a couple must agree to do so.
 - 3. All candidates must agree in writing to the provisions for term of office and selection of successors, and pledge to maintain them.
- D. If the Baron and /or Baroness have reached the four-year tenure limit, or if the Crown judges that their support is insufficient for a second term, a poll shall be conducted to determine a new Baron and/or Baroness. Polling to determine the membership's preference for baronial heads shall be conducted no less than four months before the planned investiture.
 - 1. Polling forms shall be sent to all members of the Society for Creative Anachronism Incorporated who reside within the ZIP codes belonging to Ponte Alto. Each polling form shall contain the names of all candidates, a deadline date for returning the form, and a signature line. There shall also be an envelope addressed to the current Crown of Atlantia.
 - 2. Ponte Alto intends that the polling results be interpreted by the following method (Australian ballot), unless specifically prohibited by Kingdom law:

The Charter of the Barony of Ponte Alto

- a. Each respondent shall rank-order the names on the polling, with "1" being the preferred choice, "2" the second favorite, and so on. There is no minimum set on the number of names that must be ranked; the respondent may mark none, one, some, or all.
- b. The polling forms shall be sorted into piles by first preference.
- c. If no candidate [or couple] has received a clear majority, the smallest pile [i.e., the forms for the candidate [or couple] with the fewest first preferences] shall be sorted onto the remaining piles by second preference; forms with no second choice shall be discarded.
- d. This process shall continue until one candidate [or couple] has a clear majority.
- 3. Ponte Alto requests that the Crown determine their choice as the new Baron and/or Baroness within a month after the polling deadline and that the choice be communicated to the Ponte Alto seneschal in order to facilitate an orderly transition.
- 4. Ponte Alto requests that the tabulation of the polling responses be made public.
- E. If half of a Baronial couple cannot fulfill a term, the other individual may elect either to serve the remainder alone or to resign. If a sole Baronial head or both members of a couple cannot fulfill a term, a vicar shall be recommended to the Crown by the Baron and/or Baroness with the consensus of a Barony meeting.
 - 1. The vicar shall serve until a polling can be completed and a new Baron and/or Baroness installed.
 - 2. Time spent as vicar shall not affect eligibility to serve term(s) as Baron or Baroness.

III. Order and Award

- A. There shall be one order, the <u>Order of the Garland</u>, to recognize contributions to the group. Fields of achievement shall include, but not be limited to, arts, service, and fighting.
- B. There shall be one award of distinction, the Bead. Fields of achievement shall include, but not be limited to, arts, service, and fighting. There is no limit to the number of times that an individual may receive this award.

IV. Disbursement of Funds

A. Shall be as stated in The Barony of Ponte Alto Financial Policy.

\lor . Barony Business Meetings

- A. Barony business meetings shall be held at least once per month.
 - 1. The meeting shall be conducted by the seneschal.
 - 2. Minutes of the meeting shall be published in the newsletter.
- B. The date, place, and time of the meetings shall be published in the newsletter
