A Merry Yule There Was Report by Annika Siltanen With photos by Rónán mac Ímair

On December 9, 2017, the Barony of Ponte Alto held a little event called Yule on the Bridge. The autocrat, Lord Hannus, appealed to the weather gods for seasonally-appropriate, festive weather, and Mother Nature delivered. As revelers gathered inside, a light snow fell throughout the day, dusting the window panes and frosting the shoulders and heads of those who ventured outdoors. The views through the windows were breathtaking, and more than a few attendees took advantage of the beautiful backdrops and took photographs commemorating the magic of the season. The young (and young-at-heart) enjoyed periodic jaunts into the arctic outdoors, playing in the snow and thoroughly enjoying themselves.

Inside, there was much merry-making! Games were set up downstairs, and there was a constant flow of people enjoying chess, senet, nine men's morris, fox and geese, and many others. Those looking for more active fun loved the games of Jomswikinger (the one with the trunk and blindfolds and whacking -with-soft-objects) and Hunker Hauser (the one with rickety platforms and a rope and balancing). All day, there



could be heard the cries of, "Hey insert-name-here?," "Yes?," "May I hit you with this bag?," "YES!," interspersed with giggling and general hilarity. There was also a thrown weapons "range" set up outside under the picnic awning, where intrepid



(and warmly-dressed) warriors could practice their aim with plastic knives and axes.

Upstairs, it was a magical wonderland of seasonal finery. Tables were decorated with garlands, fancy tablecloths, fine china, golden goblets, and delectable snacks. Lady Margaret, the winner of the table-decorating contest (as chosen by the children in attendance), even included furry animals in her decorations. The room sparkled with the light of dozens of candles. Garlands festooned doorways and the stage, and ribbons and

lights adorned nearly every surface. But the hall was not alone in its splendor. The fine people of Atlantia did not disappoint. Asked to don their finest, most festive

garb for the day, the populace was a sea of deep reds, greens, golds, and all nature of vibrant hues, in sumptuous silks, velvets, wools, and linens. Furs trimmed shoulders and wreaths and ribbons bedecked heads. Everyone was literally there "with bells on," as the site token was a merry silver jingle bell on a red satin ribbon. Many gentles participated in a mini fashion show and festive garb competition, decided by the cheers of the crowd. Lady Kunigunde and her lord enraptured all who saw them in their coordinated outfits of luxuriant black and burgundy.



But the day was more than just a feast for the eyes! Baroness Adina and Lady So-



phia cooked up a scrumptious dayboard including warm, fortifying stews, meats, pies (savory and sweet), fruit, cheeses, and bread, warm out of the oven. And for dessert? Why, cookies, of course! Ponte Alto's traditional holiday cookie bake-off was included in this Yule event, and the entrants brought their best! It was a close race (with some cookies requiring multiple tastings, even, just to be sure...), but Lord Tristan's Medieval Fine Cakes won the day. There were seasonal brews and libations galore, including warm glögg, spiced cider, seasonal beers, and cordials. Lady Maria won the brewing competition, and shared several of her delicious offerings with merrymakers. Baroness Aine and Lady Yrsa also brought dozens of gingerbread cookies

for revelers to decorate (to use as ornaments or just to eat!), an activity enjoyed by all ages and artistic ability levels!

No description of the merriment of the day



would be complete without mention of the music and dancing, however! Lord Randall graciously hosted a dance



class, followed by a Yule Ball, to the delight of participants and spectators alike. Dancers, young and old, veteran and novice, kicked up their heels and danced the afternoon away. Everyone else, gathered around the dance floor at their festooned tables, watched and ate and drank and chatted and generally enjoyed the atmosphere.


